## What's New at AMT

### AMT's Programs are Reaccredited

The National Commission for Certifying Agencies (NCCA) recently reaccredited all of AMT's exam-based certification programs for a period of five years. These include the Registered Medical Assistant (RMA), Registered Phlebotomy Technician (RPT), Certified Medical Administrative Specialist (CMAS), Registered Dental Assistant (RDA), Medical Technologist (MT) and Medical Laboratory Technician (MLT) programs. Since 1977, NCCA has been accrediting certification programs to ensure that they adhere to modern standards of practice in the industry. Not all healthcare certification agencies are NCCA accredited---in fact, very few have received such recognition. Only those organizations meeting rigorous NCCA Standards bear the NCCA seal of approval.

### New Look...Same Vision

Through this rebranding effort, AMT aims to bolster its already-strong industry position by presenting its programs and services in a much more compelling and persuasive manner. ## Reports Available to Schools

You may not aware that AMT can provide, upon request, two different reports which could prove useful when tracking student certification statistics. The first report aggregates the pass/fail information for all students that have taken the AMT certification exam during a specific time period (to be determined by you) and presents it in a summarized format. The second report also presents pass/fail information, but at the individual student level. Please note that in order for AMT to release an individual's pass/fail status, the student will have had to sign the release of information section on the application. # Q&A

**Q** When is the appropriate time for students to complete their applications?

**A** You can help your students complete and send in their applications as they near the end of the didactic part of their program. AMT will do the initial processing but will NOT consider the applications “complete” until the final transcripts are received. However, once the transcripts are received, AMT will be able to finish processing the applications.

**Q** Can students sit for the exam prior to their externship?

**A** Yes, in some instances, the students are allowed to sit for the exam prior to the start of their externship. However, please be aware that the student will not be considered officially certified until all paperwork, including the final transcript, is received and processed. Program directors can notify AMT directly to request this service.

**Q** How can I obtain applications?

## 5 Steps to AMT Certification

### 1 **Apply to AMT:**

After you have completed an approved training program or have acquired the appropriate experience (if applicable), submit your application and fee to AMT.

### 2 **AMT Processes Application:**

Once AMT receives and approves your completed application, you will receive a letter indicating how to schedule your exam.

### 3 **Prepare for the Exam:**

Resources to help you study: exam content outline, reference study materials and practice exams (for specific disciplines).

### 4 **Take the Exam:**

Exams are either offered through a school or at a Pearson VUE testing center. With computer-based exams, scores are available immediately.

### 5 **AMT Provides Certificate:**

Upon final processing of grades and documentation, AMT awards you an official certificate and membership card.
